# WATER CONSERVATION

### **Urban Conservation Measures Still in Effect**

## California

U.S. Drought Monitor

Due to improved water supply conditions around most the state, the State Water Resources Control Board has deemed that the unprecedented mandatory state-driven conservation standards in place over the last ten months can transition to conservation standards based on supply reliability considerations at the local level. However, the City is still

importing water via the San Gabriel Municipal Water District and has increased water in its aquifer to once again be selfreliant. Conservation is still important in Sierra Madre. As this is an ongoing conversation, please check the City's website for the most up to date information and regulations.

The City will continue to enforce specific prohibitions against certain water use. Prohibited water use includes:

- Hosing off sidewalks, driveways and other hardscapes;
- Washing automobiles with hoses not equipped with a shut-off nozzle;
- · Using non-recirculated water in a fountain or other decorative water feature;
- Watering lawns in a manner that causes runoff, or within 48 hours after measurable precipitation; and
- Irrigating ornamental turf on public street medians.

In the last ten months alone, the state realized nearly a 24% savings in water use as compared to the same period in 2013. The City of Sierra Madre has made its own contributions to the state's conservation efforts. From June 2015 through May 16, 2016, the City had a cumulative conservation rate of 20.99%.

Remember, small changes can make a big difference. Since August, some 1.30 million acre-feet of water was conserved throughout California; enough to supply 6.5 million people with water for an entire year.

### Water Penalties Set to Increase

This year's El Niño rains have had a limited impact on our part of the state. Water conservation remains as critical as ever as California enters into its fifth year of drought. Sierra Madre City Council approved a measure earlier this year that increases the penalty rate assessed on excess water use.

The City of Sierra Madre would like to thank its water-wise customers for doing their part to make every drop count. The latest water billing numbers for May show 75% of Sierra Madre customers met, or outperformed, their water conservation targets. The remaining 25% of customers are of increasing concern for the City, as many of the customers who exceeded their water use target in the month have a repeat history of doing so.

The City of Sierra Madre will introduce a new water penalty rate beginning on July 1, 2016. The rate will apply to each billing unit used in excess of a customer's conservation target. The current penalty rate is \$5.04/unit. The new rate will increase to \$10.72, or two times the Tier 4 rate.


### **Save Water and Reduce Mosquitoes**



Due to the recent drought, many pools and ponds have dried up. Any standing water left at the bottom of those containers makes a perfect habitat for mosquitoes. Be on the AEDES MOSQUITO lookout for Aedes albopictus, commonly

known as the Asian tiger mosquito, one of three invasive mosquito species found in LA County. Health officials are asking residents to remove breeding sources from their home.

Invasive Aedes are different from our common mosquitoes and have traits which make them very difficult to manage. Their eggs are extremely resilient and are laid in small containers of water. Traditional pesticide treatments provide just short term relief and are not a permanent solution. Learn more at: www. sgvmosquito.org/.



### **Paramedic Subscription Program Helps You Manage Out-of-Pocket Costs**

One call for emergency paramedic services can cost over \$1,000. Many times the cost associated with these services is not covered in full by medical insurance. To help offset the high fees, the City of Sierra Madre created the Sierra Madre Paramedic Subscription Program.

The annual membership program, available to all residents, serves as a secondary insurance plan and covers the out-of-pocket costs associated with emergency medical care. Program membership provides coverage, after insurance billing, for emergency medical treatment and/or ambulance treatment rendered by the Sierra Madre Fire Department.

The annual membership cost is \$60 per individual. Enrollment forms are available online and at City Hall. Online service payment and registration coming soon! 


